Main Purposes of the Job and Key Tasks

We are looking to appoint a committed and flexible person who will assist Spring Community Hub in providing healthy and culturally appropriate food to people in our community who would otherwise struggle to feed themselves and their families.

This role will support the Food Services Coordinator in running our Spring Social Supermarket(Triple S) at our Lewington and Walworth Community Centres, ensuring it meets all relevant Health and Safety standards as well as Food Hygiene Protocols.

The post holder will oversee the Shop at Vestry Road, including all customer Service volunteers (Chaperones), to deliver excellent customer service.

The postholder will support the Food Services Coordinator and the volunteers (Chaperones)

The postholder will play a key role in providing excellent customer service and safe working practices at all times.

The post holder will effectively promote the service in the community to reach as many members as possible and contribute to the project running in a financially viable way.

Through offering healthy food at a reduced cost, you will assist the organisation in helping transform the lives of those struggling with food insecurity in our community.

The post holder will be required to be flexible to the changing needs of the organisation and, as such, undertake tasks and responsibilities not specifically listed here but relevant to the smooth running of SCH, including general administrative tasks and aspects of service delivery, as directed by the Food Services Coordinator.

Main Duties will include:

- Meet and greet customers visiting the Triple S in a Welcoming, warm and friendly way.
- Ensure that you work to the highest safeguarding standards.
- Ensure that you work to the highest food safety standards.
- Check members in and out on the Social Supermarket CRM and take payments.
- Ensure payments are recorded and tally with the cash system.
- Assist customers with their shopping
- Registration of all new members on the CRM.
- Ensure the shelves are kept well stocked and well presented.
- Help promote Triple S across all Spring Projects and Southwark.
- Signpost customers to other Spring Community Hub services and projects, as well as support services outside.
- Promote well-being and financial security, increase good health and reduction of isolation in work to reduce isolation
- Support all Triple S volunteers and supporters

Stock and Hygiene Controls

- Receiving deliveries and stock.
- Assist with correctly and safely storing goods.
- Sort and prepare stock according to food safety standards.
- Ensure that the goods are in date and in good condition.
- Operate a First-in-first-out stock system.
- Keep the storeroom and all the equipment clean and tidy.
- Assist with basic cleaning duties.

Promoting the Project

- Promote the project to recruit new members and ensure that they are signed up on the Your Local Pantry database.
- Be part of the Pantry team to go door to door in campaigning and introducing the Pantry to the local community.
- Promote the project to other areas of London as an example of good practice.

- Assist the Food Service Coordinator in achieving the social impact set out to bring the project towards financial sustainability.
